### **Intercultural Dialogue Sub-group Report to Management Group Meeting in Lille 15.11.10**

Since the last meeting in Jönköping in Sweden in November 2009 the Intercultural Dialogue Sub-group managed to:

1. Revise and complete the information about the activities of the sub-group for the web site.
2. Discuss and prepare a set of definitions of intercultural education.
3. Complete bibliography and links.
4. Prepare the meeting in Hamburg on 5-7 May 2010.
5. Discuss the competences of volunteers in the aspect of intercultural dialogue on the basis of the translation of Ilkyar Volunteer Projects Manual, made by Emrah Yıldırım.
6. Discuss some relevant case studies, prepared by Emese Marosszéki.
7. Review the VALUE website and collect the ideas
  - definitions of intercultural education should be put on the website;
  - the reports of the partners of the sub-group in English and original languages should be put on the website;
  - the case study, prepared by the Hungarian volunteer should be translated into English and put on the website.
8. Prepare the workshops “LLL through volunteering: Principles, intercultural aspects, good practices and methods”, led by the members of subgroup D during VALUE Network Meeting in Lille in November 2010

  1. “LLL through volunteering, principles” - introduction to the topic presented by Sabine Remdisch.
  2. “Intercultural aspects of volunteering” - presentation of ILKYAR program prepared by Emrah Yıldırım + Interactive discussion of the rules put into the manual led by Emrah.
  3. “Good practices of intercultural education activities” - prepared by Malgorzata Kolodziejczyk.
  4. “Twelve step program for successful volunteer coordinators” - interactive presentation by Emese Marosszéki.
